Dow's Louisiana Operations began in 1956 with the purchase of four plantations in Iberville and West Baton Rouge parishes. Our 1,500-acre integrated manufacturing facility near Plaquemine and our brine operations in Grand Bayou today comprise one of the largest petrochemical manufacturing operations in Louisiana.
